DO YOUR RESEARCH

The MGC consists of historically African-American, Latino/a, East-Asian, South Asian, and Multicultural organizations. Look up EACH organization's mission, goal, motto, and national programs/service initiatives and see what matches your interests.



SEEK OUT MEMBERS ON-CAMPUS

Attending the Involvement Fair, Meet the Greeks, individual information sessions, chapter programs and service activities will help you get to know members of the organizations you are interested in joining. Be able to talk about your campus/community involvement, service experience, and personal/professional ambitions. Also be sure to dress properly for the event you are attending.



MAKE YOUR INTEREST KNOWN

Don't be afraid to walk up to a member of an organization and express your interest. A discreet, face-to-face interaction shows stronger interest and intent than a DM on social media.



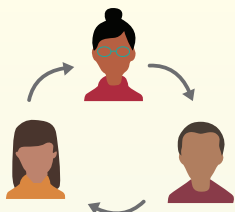
REGISTER FOR RECRUITMENT

Visit the Office of Fraternity & Sorority Affairs' Greek Recruitment page (<https://webapps.rutgers.edu/greekrecruiting/>) to have your eligibility to join an organization verified. This is a requirement for anyone interested in joining a fraternity/sorority at Rutgers University.



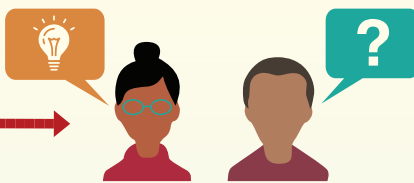
LOOK UP MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS

The Rutgers University membership requirement is a minimum 2.5 GPA, 12 college credits, and full-time enrollment. Transfer students are eligible to join in their first semester at Rutgers. NO one is permitted to join an organization with less than a 2.5 GPA. Additional chapter requirements (costs, time commitment, GPA, etc.) vary based on chapter/national organization policies.



CONTINUE TO ENGAGE

Stay involved in the activities of the organization and attend programs/community service events. Continue to build a rapport with current members of the chapters. Expressing interest does not end after the initial conversation and your actions will always speak louder than your words.



MAKE A CHOICE

Your research and consistent engagement should eventually lead you to the organization that best aligns with your goals and values, both personally and professionally. This is a LIFELONG commitment so be sure that you have made the best decision for YOU! Do NOT rush your decision.
