Office of Fraternity & Sorority Affairs Academic Policy

The Office of Fraternity and Sorority Affairs expects fraternities and sororities to promote the academic achievement of its members. With this in mind the following academic polices must be followed:

General Information

- 1. Each semester (fall and spring), the total chapter must achieve a 2.5 GPA.
- 2. Each semester (fall and spring), the new member class must achieve a 2.5 GPA.
- 3. The chapter GPA and new member class GPA computation is based upon the December and April Roster Updates. Once the roster update is completed, no changes will be made.

Academic Plan of Action

- 1. Chapters (total chapter) that fail to achieve a 2.5 GPA will be placed on an Academic Plan of Action.
- 2. Chapters whose New Member class fails to achieve a 2.5 GPA will be placed on an Academic Plan of Action
- 3. An Academic Plan of Action lasts for one semester and consists of required chapter programming and a reduction of chapter activities. Failure to complete the Plan of Action provisions in a timely manner may result in a change of the chapter's recognition status.
- 4. If the chapter (total chapter) subsequently achieves a 2.5 GPA, the Academic Plan of Action will be lifted.

Academic Probation

- 1. If the chapter (total chapter) fails to achieve a 2.5 GPA at the end of the Academic Plan of Action, the chapter will be placed on Academic Probation.
- 2. If the following New Member class fails to achieve a 2.5 GPA at the end of the Academic Plan of Action, the chapter will be placed on Academic Probation.
- 3. Academic Probation lasts for one semester and consists of a total cessation of chapter activities. Failure to abide by the terms of the Academic Probation may result in a change in the chapter's recognition status.
- 4. To be removed from Academic Probation, the chapter (total chapter) and the subsequent New Member class must achieve a 2.5 GPA.
- 5. Failure to achieve a 2.5 GPA (total chapter and/or the New Member class) will result in the loss of university recognition for a minimum of four academic years.
